

FRUITS MANDARIN PUPPETRY SCRIPT 水果|Shu ǐ Gu ǒ

Myla很饿 | Myla Hěn È (Myla Is Hungry)

Keywords: 我很饿|wŏ hĕn è (I'm hungry), -|yī (one), =|èr (two), =|sān (three), 四|sì (four), 五|w ǔ (five), 六|liù (six), 七|qī (seven), 八|bā (eight), 九|ji ǔ (nine), +|shí (ten)

• Prepare:

O Be sure that you can easily access Myla in your bag. Check before class to make sure the puppet is clean and review what you'll be teaching.

• Perform:

- Make a sound like a bird.
- Ask the class, "Did you hear something? I think I heard Myla! Can we call her out?".
- Instruct the class to repeat Myla Birdie with a fun rhythm as you prepare your hand in the puppet inside of the Bilingual Birdies bag.
- Myla enters with an exciting melody or gesture.
- O Instruct the children to repeat "你好Myla | ní hǎo Myla!".
- O Look at the Myla and say, "Myla, 你好吗 | Myla, ní hǎo ma?".
- Myla responds, "**我很饿|wŏ hěn è!**"
- O Explain to the children that Myla is hungry. Invite the children to repeat **我很饿|wŏ** hěn è with Myla three times.
- Explain that the class is going to get some apples for Myla to eat. Look up and pretend to see an apple tree.
- Instruct the children to reach their hands up and repeat after you as you pick ten apples for Myla to eat.
- Count to ten in Mandarin saying each number twice and encouraging the children to count with you. "一|yī (one), 二|èr (two), 三|sān (three), 四|sì (four), 五|wǔ (five), 六|liù (six), 七|qī (seven), 八|bā (eight), 九|jiǔ (nine), 十|shí (ten)".
- Invite children to hold out their hand and pretend to feed Myla.
- Go up to each child and have Myla eat apples out of their hands.
- Explain that Myla is so full from all of the yummy apples she ate. Tell the children she is going to take a nap now.
- Encourage the children to repeat "再见 | zài jiàn Myla!".
- Myla exits with the same melody or gesture.

• Challenge:

• Once the children are confident counting to ten, have them count to twenty.
